### Guest Speaker

Councillor Michael Desmond, who is our Chief Speaker, came to our assembly on Monday. He spoke to the children about the services Hackney Council do and the role of councillors. It was a fun assembly and he ended his talk by suggesting that the children watch Charlie Chaplin films. Councillor Desmond was very impressed by the changes he noticed at Northwold and said that everyone knows just how successful our school is.

### Bang Goes the Theory at Northwold

Bang Goes The Theory is a BBC1 half hour show looking at contemporary science issues. They intend to devote a whole programme to influenza and they've asked Northwold School to help them! They are intending to film an outbreak of 'flu in a school to see how the outbreak travels throughout the school, and its effects in terms of student and staff health. They would like us

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to call them when a pupil or member of staff gets the flu. During the outbreak they'd like to film the school during assembly (so they can gauge the fall in pupil numbers and our procedures for dealing with it), in some classes, in the playground, and in the staff room. They'd also like to find a pupil with whom they could film at school and at home as the flu affects them. It's possible that they might be able to enlist some health workers from Public Health England to visit the school during the outbreak and collect swabs for analysis. Some of the filming will be done by a small two or three person film crew; some might be slightly larger scale involving a four person crew and a presenter, probably Maggie Philbin or Liz Bonnin.

Please do ensure that the school knows if you do not want your child to be filmed.
