Medical Appointments and Holidays

We are currently seeing a large number of children missing lessons because they are having medical appointments during school hours. Also holidays cannot be taken in school term time and the school cannot authorise this time away from school. We can only give permission for your child to be out of school in exceptional circumstances and parents/carers must apply to Ms Kriel in writing for permission. We thank you for your cooperation in these matters.
